

BOTTOM LINE: Put others first because Jesus put you first.

Read Philippians 2:3

The Last Player

Ask your family members if they would like to play a game with you and allow them to pick the game. This can be a game that you already have in your house. After they have decided on the game, allow everyone to take their turn first which puts you last. Allowing everyone to go first shows them that you care more about them than you do being first.

Look for ways that you can always put others first.

Know that putting other's needs above yours shows you value them.

Jesus' Example

"Dear God, Thank You for sending Your Son, Jesus, to earth to be an example of how we should put others first. I pray that I can always try to put others first. Even when it's really hard. I love You, amen."

READ PHILIPPIANS 2:3

Write out today's verse in the space to the right. Go ahead. We'll wait.

Done? Awesome. Put a box around the word "anything." What does that word include? Well, everything! If you find yourself doing something just to get ahead or win or be first, "DON'T!" Instead, choose humility.

Humility is putting others first by giving up what you think you deserve. Our focus should be on others. When we give up what we deserve, putting others first just comes naturally.

That's what Jesus did. Did Jesus choose to die on the cross to get ahead? No way! He could have stopped that whole thing any time He wanted to. Jesus could have said, "You know what, I'm done with all this. Send in an army of angels to rescue me." But He didn't. Instead, Jesus faced all the pain of the cross, He gave up everything He deserved to put you first.

So the next time you find yourself doing "anything" to get ahead, stop. Remember what Jesus has done for you and ask Him to help you put others first this week.

READ PHILIPPIANS 2:4

Have you ever completed one of those "hidden picture" pages or tried to spot things in an I Spy book? The most helpful part of those puzzles is the list of things to look for on the side of the page. After all, if you don't know what to look for, you might waste a lot of time searching for the wrong thing.

Today's verse gives us a clue of what to look out for when it comes to following Jesus. Instead of always looking out for your own good, for the things that make you happy, we should do what? Yep, look out for the good of others! When it comes to humility, we always have to put "you" (that's others around us) before "me."

Here's a little "I spy" challenge for you. For the next 24 hours, pay attention to the people around you. If you spot an opportunity to help or do good for someone else, do it. Ask God to help you put others first this week by spying ways you can help!



DAY 2

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READ PHILIPPIANS 2:5-7

Jesus chose to leave the beauty and perfection of heaven to come to earth in a human body. He chose to live a regular life instead of entering the world as a rightful king or powerful ruler. Jesus came to serve, to love others, to help, and most importantly, to SAVE. Because of His obedience to live this way and to die on the cross for us, we can have a relationship with God forever. Jesus has given us the ultimate example of humility by choosing to put us first.

Take out of a piece of paper and write the word "JESUS" in large block letters in the center of the page. All around the page, write out words that describe how you could become more like Jesus. Here are a few examples to get you started: loving, listening, serving, helping.

When you finish, take a look at your page and thank God for sending Jesus. Ask God to help you follow Him by putting others first this week.

READ PHILIPPIANS 2:8

Jesus chose to put us first, to do what God asked even though it meant going all the way to the cross. Jesus chose obedience and humility. And because He died and rose again, we can be forgiven and become a part of God's family. If you believe in what Jesus did, if you've made a choice to trust Him as your Savior, then your main job is to treat everyone around you like Jesus did.

Because Jesus listened when people were hurting, you should listen well.


Because Jesus showed compassion to the people around Him, you should show compassion.

Because Jesus taught others about God, you should tell others about Him.

Because Jesus consistently gave up what He wanted to put others first, you should put others first too.

DAY 2

Read Philippians 2:3-7a

In the re-write of Philippians 2:3-7a below, write in the words that have been substituted by a math symbol.

Don't do anything only to get ahead. Don't do it because you are proud. Instead, be humble. Value others > yourselves. 0 of you should look out just for your own good. Each of you should also look out for the good of others. As you deal with 1 another, you should think + act as Jesus did. In his very nature he was God. Jesus was = with God. But Jesus didn't take advantage of that fact. Instead, he made himself **0**.

You may not think of humility like a math equation, but it kind of is! It means making others > yourself. We have the best example in Jesus, who made himself 0 . . . nothing . . . even though He is = with God!

(Answers: more than, none, one, and, equal, nothing)

DAY 3

Look back at yesterday's equation. The math may not be hard, but there is a super hard part of the equation: making others > ourselves, or making ourselves 0. Easy to solve, not so easy to live!

Thankfully, we not only have Jesus' example, but we also have God's help. We just need to ask Him. Fill out the blanks in the prayer below. Then, as you read the prayer out loud, move as the words in parentheses guide you.

"Dear Jesus, thank You for coming down from heaven (kneel with one knee on the floor) and humbling Yourself to die for me. The fact that You, God's Son, would give up Your life for me (put your hand on your chest) is amazing to me. I am incredibly thankful, and I want to follow in your footsteps (walk a few steps) and put others first too (take a big step back). One area or person I have trouble with humility is _____. If that's not possible, or if there's not one particular person, then find a trusted friend or parent and share with them your struggles to put others first. Ask them how they've struggled with humility too, and together, share one area where you can each **put others first** because Jesus put you first.
