Know that even though you are young you can help others in big ways.




Initiate Prayer

Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.



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
Initiative is seeing what needs to be done and doing it.

DAY 1

Read Proverbs 6:6-8

This month is all about initiative which is seeing what needs to be done and doing it! Seeing a need is only half the battle. In order to show real initiative, we actually have to get busy and help! When it comes to showing initiative, we can't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done. Even if it's not your mess. Even if you have other more fun things to do. God wants you to see a need and do something to help.

DAY 2

Read Galatians 6:2

Taking initiative requires seeing a need and doing something about it. When do you know someone is in need? As our verse describes, it might look like someone carrying something heavy or it just might be noticing when a friend needs extra encouragement to finish a math problem. Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done. Take initiative to solve the problem.

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DAY 3

Read 1 John 3:17

Have you ever watched a movie where someone needed help and people walked right by without helping? How did that make you feel? Were you frustrated? Maybe you even yelled at the screen, "Stop! That guy needs help!"

It's pretty easy to point out when *other* people do this. But how about when it's you? Are you tempted to sit back and let someone else deal with it?

When we see a job that needs to be done, the best thing we can do is to show initiative and help. And what's even better, when you step forward to help, you show others God's love for them. Pretty cool, huh?

DAY 4

When Nehemiah found out about the brokendown walls and the situation happening in his hometown, he was sad and upset. He could have said, "I'm so sad to hear this news. I hope someone steps up to help." But he didn't. Nehemiah was brave enough to tell the king (his boss) what was happening. He had no idea how the king would respond. We know the rest of the story. The King agreed that he should go and even gave him what he needed so he could. Nehemiah didn't wait for someone else to do what needed to be done. And you shouldn't either.

Ask God to help you remove all the excuses when you see there's a job to be done.

Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done.





A Devotional on Initiative

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Read Nehemiah 1:1-2:18

As you read Nehemiah 1:1-2:18, label each paragraph in your Bible with the following steps Nehemiah took as he showed initiative. (Note: Some of these will be used more than once.)

- 1. Forming a plan
- 2. Asking others for help
- 3. Hearing about the problem
- 4. Putting plan into action
- 5. Checking out the problem
- 6. Being sad about the problem
- 7. Asking God for help

Day 3

Nehemiah's first response when he heard about people suffering was to turn to God and ask for help.

Day 4

Nehemiah showed true initiative when it came to rebuilding the wall, but he also recognized he couldn't go it alone.

Think back to the person or situation you prayed about yesterday. How could you lean into others for support as you do what needs to be done? Maybe you don't even know what would help. Find a friend or adult to brainstorm ideas with. Maybe you have a great idea already, but you need friends to put it into action. Or, maybe it's something you can do on your own, but you need trusted friends to pray for you.

Day 5

What around you needs to be done?

Today is action day! Time to put all those prayers and plans into action and do

what needs to be done. Before you get started, reread Nehemiah 1:1-2:18 and pay attention to the steps Nehemiah took . . . from hearing about the problem and asking God and others for help, all the way to forming a plan and putting it into action. Then write out your own version of these steps, and follow your plan!

And remember, even if your friends don't follow through to help, you can get it done. **Don't wait for someone else to do what needs to be done!**
