Truth, Please


Choosing to tell the truth can be hard. We need to ask for help! Ask God to help you learn to have integrity in life.

DAY 1

Read Exodus 20:16

Has anyone ever said something about you that wasn't true? How did it make you feel? To "bear false witness" is when you make up a story about someone that's not true. You can't really trust a person that makes up lies about someone else.

Being truthful is a big deal to God. When you're not truthful, you lose trust. God wants to help us see that choosing to be honest in words and actions protects our relationships with others.

Truth Leads To Trust

Grab a piece of paper. Write the phrase TRUTH LEADS TO TRUST across the center of the page. Draw pictures around the words to depict their meaning.

Pray and thank God for always being honest and trustworthy. Ask God to help you live with integrity this week so others can trust you too.



DAY 2

Read Ephesians 4:25

The human heart sends blood to every part of your body all day, every day. The average heart beats about a hundred thousand times a day! Cool, right? But as amazing as it is, it needs the rest of you to actually work!

Just like the heart needs the rest of your body to do its best work, you need the people around you to be the best at who God made you to be.

We're all connected. That's why dishonesty can be so damaging. The next time you have the opportunity to tell the truth, think about how you're connected to the person you're talking with. Protect that relationship by choosing honesty!

Check Your Pulse

Check your pulse by placing your index finger on your neck or your wrist. Can you feel it beating? Ask a parent to set a timer for one minute. Count the number of beats. Take that number and multiply it by 60. That will tell you how many times your heart beats in an hour. Then take that number and multiple it by 24 to figure out how many beats per day!




Day 2

When you're not truthful, you lose trust, but let's get real: sometimes it's hard to be completely truthful—especially when we know it might get us in trouble.



Day 4

Find a trusted friend and grab a scarf or other piece of cloth.

Take turns leading each other either through the house or around your yard outside while one of you is blindfolded. No peeking! It takes a lot of trust to make it safely around when you can't see, doesn't it?

Why is it important for people to trust you? That's a big question, isn't it? Why IS it important for people to trust you? Take a few minutes and talk about why trust was important when you were playing the game, then follow it up with a conversation about why trust is important in real life.



Day 5

Sometimes we don't even realize that we're not being truthful.

We can make promises that we don't follow through on, or we can decide doing something we said we wouldn't do really isn't that bad. Creating some accountability for yourself is important as you work toward being a person of integrity.

This week make a Trust Board for yourself. It can be a dry erase board that your parents don't need, or you can simply make it on a large white piece of paper or poster board.

Write down two categories. Things I said I WOULD do. Things I said I WOULDN'T do.

Now think through the last couple of days. What are some things you told your parents or friends you would do and things you promised you wouldn't do? Write them down under the appropriate column. Keep adding to the board all week long, crossing through the item when you follow through. If you are having trouble being truthful, go back to the prayer you prayed earlier this week and say it out loud to God again.
