Memory Verse

"A child will be born to us. A son will be given to us." Isaiah 9:6, NIrV

Bible Story

Jesus Is Born Luke 2:1-7

Bottom Line

You can have joy because God sent Jesus.

Activity

Gift Wrap Race

What You Need:

Two boxes, two sets of wrapping supplies (wrapping paper, tape, kid-friendly scissors, bow)

What You Do:

Set out the two boxes and two sets of wrapping supplies. Invite your child to have a gift-wrapping race with you. Explain that on the count of three, the two of you will race to see who can wrap their box the fastest.

The rules are:

- The box has to be completely covered.
- The paper has to be taped closed.
- The bow has to be on the top.

Count to three, then see who can wrap their gift the fastest, according to the rules.

When you're finished, say, "That was fun! And I think we can agree that UNwrapping gifts is even more fun than wrapping them! In our story today, we heard about the greatest gift we could ever receive."

Talk About the Bible Story

Why is Jesus the best gift ever given? (Because He came to be our Savior)

How can our relationship with Jesus give us joy?

In the middle of everything going on this time of year, how can we take time to remember the real meaning of Christmas?

How can we share the gift of Jesus with our friends? (We can tell others about Him, invite others to come to church with us.)

Parent: Share about how you've celebrated Christmas in different seasons of your life. Explain what the holiday meant to you when you were a child and when you were a young adult, and what it means to you today. Talk about the joy that you've experienced throughout your life in celebrating Jesus' birth.



Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"Dear God, thank You for keeping Your promise to send Your Son, Jesus. Jesus really is the greatest gift we could ever receive. Because of Jesus, our broken relationship with You can be restored, and we know that one day You will make everything right again. Please help us always remember to have joy because You sent Jesus. We pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

Activity

Finishing Each Other's Sentences

What You Need:

Two sheets of paper, two writing utensils

What You Do:

Invite your child to do an activity with you. Explain that you'll read the start of a statement that has to do with today's story. You and your child will both complete that statement by writing down what you think the other person will say.

Statements:

- One question I'd love to ask Mary is . . .
- Something I don't understand about this story is . . .
- One thing in this story that stood out to me was . . .
- Jesus' birth matters because . . .
- I wonder if ...
- The story of Jesus' birth reminds me that...

When you're finished, take time to share what both of you wrote down for each statement.

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Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"Dear God, thank You for this reminder about the real reason we celebrate Christmas. Help us to not get so caught up in the lights and gifts that we lose sight of what is most important—that You sent Your Son, Jesus, to be our Savior. You brought joy to the world when Jesus was born... and we are so thankful! We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."
